What's the Value of a Home Inspection?

- Help you get to know and understand the home you're buying
 - Learn maintenance tips
 - Learn about the major systems throughout the home
- Find expensive problems before they become your responsibility
- Find smaller issues so you know what you may need to work on once you own the home

What Does a Home Inspector Inspect?

- Visual inspection primarily focused on safety and functionality issues
- Every major system of your home
 - Structure foundation, water penetration, cracks, basement
 - Exterior facings, trim, windows, gutters, driveways, sidewalks, decks, patios, balconies
 - Roof covering, structure, flashings, vents
 - Chimneys chase, lining, caps
 - Electrical main box, sub-panels, outlets, switches
 - HVAC furnace, A/C
 - Water Heater tank, drafting
 - Plumbing visible piping, leaks
 - Attic rafters, insulation, vents, ventilation
 - Interior walls, ceilings, floors, windows, appliances

What is Not Part of a Normal Home Inspection?

- Home inspections are not code inspections
- Home inspections are not invasive we don't take things apart or look inside walls etc.
- Home inspectors are not contractors, so we generally won't give quotes on repair costs
- Home inspectors cannot do the repair work ourselves
- Home inspectors do not inspect systems owned by utilities or municipalities
- Sometimes specialty inspections will be recommended i.e. mold, termite or structural

How Will You Receive the Information?

- Most inspectors provide on-site reports, either hand written or computer generated
- Plan to attend the inspection it will be a much more valuable experience for you

What Should You Expect to Pay for an Inspection?

- Remember cheaper is not always better
- Pricing will vary based on size/age/complexity of home
